Actos preparatorios punibles del llamado iter criminis

Solo cuando expresamente así se indique serán **punibles los actos preparatorios**. Cuando se supere la preparación, estaremos antes una tentativa o una consumación del delito. En estos casos, la tentativa o la consumación, incompatibles con los actos preparatorios, absorberán aquéllas a éstos.

Asimismo, por más que la ley conceptúe a los actos preparatorios como resoluciones manifestadas, tanto la conspiración, como la proposición como la provocación para delinquir son punibles. En ocasiones se puede llegar a calificar como un tipo penal propio, lo que tiene apariencia de actos preparatorios.

Conspiración

1. La conspiración existe cuando dos o más personas se conciertan para la ejecución de un delito y resuelven ejecutarlo.
2. La proposición existe cuando el que ha resuelto cometer un delito invita a otra u otras personas a participar en él.

Para **diferenciarla de la tentativa**, se ha de precisar que, mientras la tentativa es la progresión de un grado de ejecución del delito; la conspiración se trata de una progresión en un grado de ideación, que necesita del oportuno concierto de voluntades, serio y real, para la ejecución de un delito, sin que sea preciso que exista en ese momento un diseño acabado del modo de realizar la acción delictiva, esto es, un reparto de papeles, la fecha de la perpetración, el escenario concreto, ni siquiera el objetivo personal.

Delito omisión

El que no socorriere a una persona que se halle desamparada y en peligro manifiesto y grave, cuando pudiese hacerlo sin riesgo propio ni de terceros.

En las mismas penas incurrirá el que, impedido de prestar socorro, no demande con urgencia auxilio ajeno.

Las violaciones de la ley son legalmente inexpugnables debido a los precedentes (violaciones de la ley) establecidos por casos judiciales. Tales situaciones violan numerosas intenciones y propósitos específicamente declarados de la Constitución, como se establece en el Preámbulo. APLICABLE A CUALQUIER PERSONA EN CUALQUIER PODER DEL GOBIERNO

Violations of law are legally unassailable due to precedents (violations of law) established by court cases. Such situations violate numerous specifically stated intents and purposes of the Constitution, as set forth in the Preamble. APPLICABLE TO ANYONE IN ANY BRANCH OF GOVERNMENT
